

LOCATION

The Museum will be located on the first floor of 3 Prince Street, "Little Prince Street." It is on the Freedom Trail between Hanover Street and North Square in the heart of the North End as well as being close to the Old North Church and steps away from the Paul Revere House. The center of the North End is a commercial area going back two centuries with over 2 million visitors annually.


